## Matten Ready To Run For H-N MPP

HAGERSVILLE—After volunteering for the Ontario Liberal Party for over 10 years, Dan Matten is ready to take the next step and run as Provincial Liberal Candidate in Haldimand-Norfolk.

"I have always been interested in politics and, as I continued to volunteer, I decided I wanted to be an active part of creating solutions for our community, province and country," said Matten.

Matten and his wife have called Hagersville home for 22 years, after leaving Germany for "opportunity and adventure" in Canada. The couple welcomed a son and a daughter in the next few years and gained a love of the community through the friends and neighbours that they met.

As his family grew, Matten became involved in his church, the Hagersville Lions Club and the local Chamber of Commerce. He says he is passionate about his community and thinks working at Queens Park is the next step.

He is ready to begin working towards an election and knows running against Haldimand-Norfolk MPP Toby Barrett will be a challenge.

"Experience counts for a lot, but I believe our community is ready for fresh eyes and someone who is eager and ready to accomplish things in Toronto," said Matten.

Besides running against Barrett, Matten is aware that not everyone is happy with what the Ontario Liberal Party and Premier Kathleen Wynne have accomplished in the past four years. But, Matten is still positive and says the work they have done will prove itself in the future. He also believes the Liberal Party and Liberal ideas are what the province and country need.
